Austin Brezina



Austin R. Brezina is a Holy Cross seminarian in the Old College undergraduate seminary program. Brother John was born in Berea, Ohio. After graduating from St. Ignatius High School, he entered the Old College undergraduate seminary program at the University of Notre Dame. He pursued a Bachelors of Arts in American Studies and Philosophy and is currently studying for the Masters of Divinity Program. During his time as an undergraduate, he learned about the life with the Holy Cross Brothers and discerned a vocation to the Brother's Society.

During his senior year, he wrote "Where Have All the Brothers Gone: Exploring the Identity and Mission of Religious Brothers in American Catholicism." Currently, he is a full-time student, serves as the *de facto* chaplain for the Notre Dame Fire Department, as a liturgical volunteer at the Indiana State Prison, and as an advisor for the Catholic Peace Fellowship. Brother George Klawitter, retired in 2012, as a full professor from the English Literature Department at St. Edward's University. A frequent contributor to the Holy Cross History Conference, he has published letters written by the early Brothers in Indiana (*Adapted to the Lake*), letters written by the Brothers in Africa (*Holy Cross in Algeria*), and an account of the beginning of the Community (*The Brothers of St. Joseph*). His book Early Men of Holy Cross
